The Campbell County Board of Supervisors met with the staff and councils of the Town of Altavista and the Town of Brookneal for a dinner meeting at the Golden Skillet Restaurant. Prior to the meeting, many members enjoyed a tour of a new business in the Town of Brookneal, American Plastic Fabricators.

Following dinner, Clif Tweedy gave an update on the construction and renovation projects currently underway in Rustburg known as the Master Plan Phase I project. The project includes a new Citizens Services Building, new Maintenance Building and renovations to the Courthouse. Once the first floor of the Haberer Building and County Office Building were vacated, Management Services and Human Resources would relocate to the first floor of the Haberer Building. Economic Development would move to the second floor of the Haberer Building where Management Services was currently located, and Public Works would be located with them. The County Office Building would be used as overflow for Social Services.

Paul Harvey, Director of Community Development, gave an overview of the Comprehensive Plan update. The Planning Commissions of the Towns have been invited to meet with the County Planning Commission to focus on land use as well as infrastructure. Both Towns were in the process of updating their Comprehensive Plans. Everyone agreed the objective was for all three comprehensive plans to complement each other and blend as far as land use, utilities and infrastructure. Bob Jean wanted to include the possibility of a boundary line agreement between the County and the Town of Brookneal in the planning process.

There was a brief discussion concerning the recent hearings before the State Water Control Board. Everyone was pleased at the outcome of the hearings concerning the flows down the Staunton River. After deliberating for some time, the State Water Control Board decided the water flows would be a continuous type that would slow the erosion of stream banks and hopefully give the property owners stable lake levels.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
