

# Campbell County Statistics

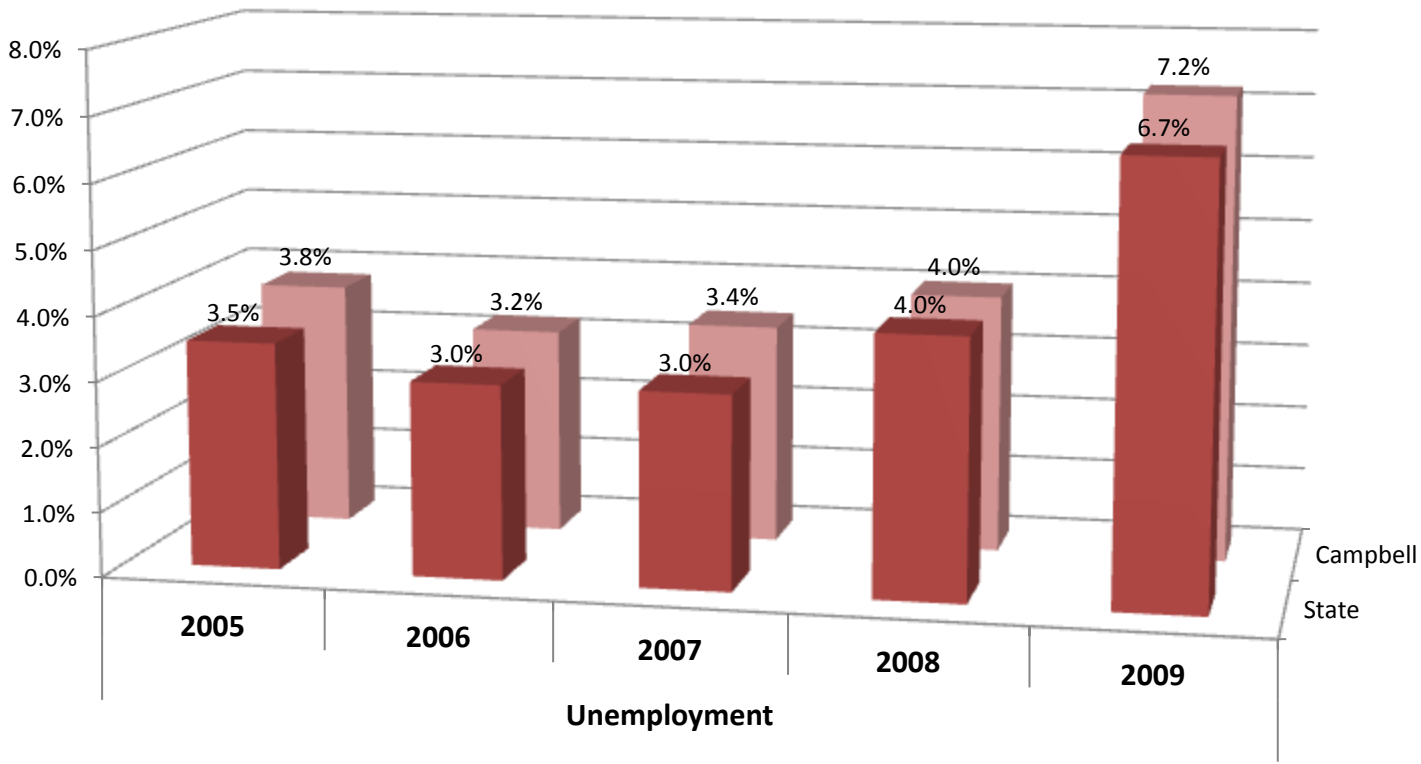
2005 to 2010

# Unemployment

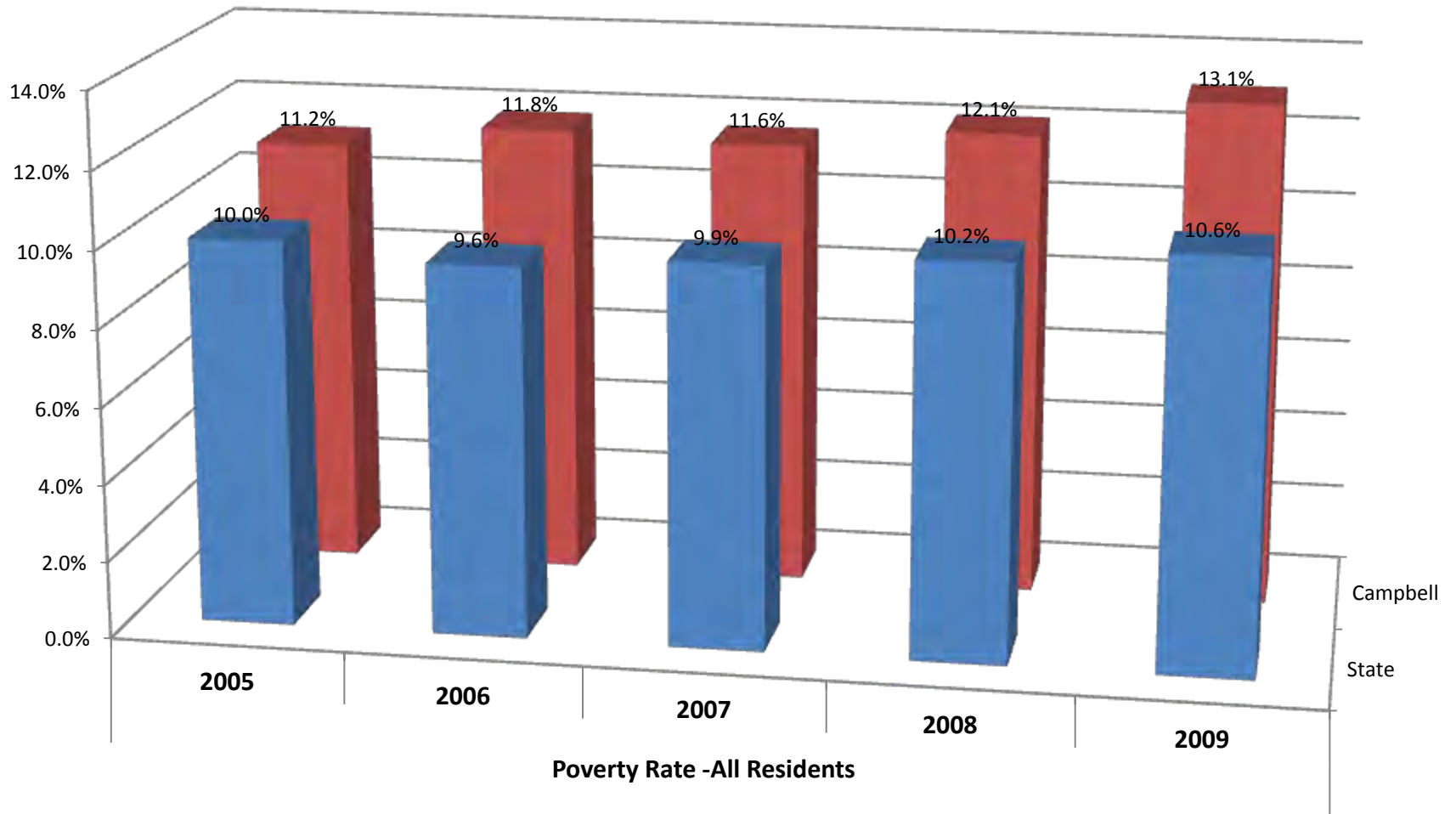
The next slide shows the percentage of unemployment for Campbell County and the State of Virginia.

The trend shows a steady increase in the number of people unemployed since 2006. Campbell County is higher than the state average.



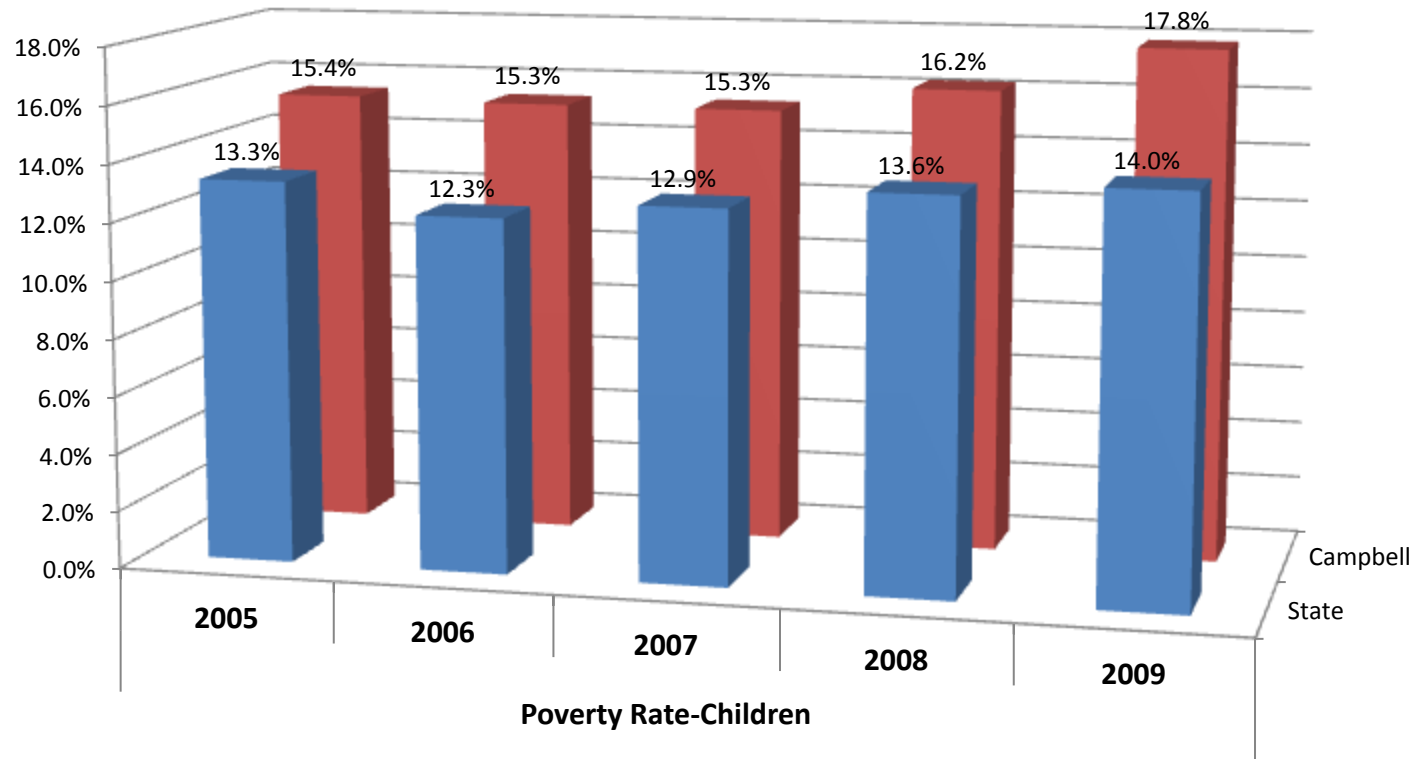
# Poverty Rate

The overall poverty rate has been increasing since 2005. The rate in Campbell County is higher than the state average.



# Child Poverty Rate

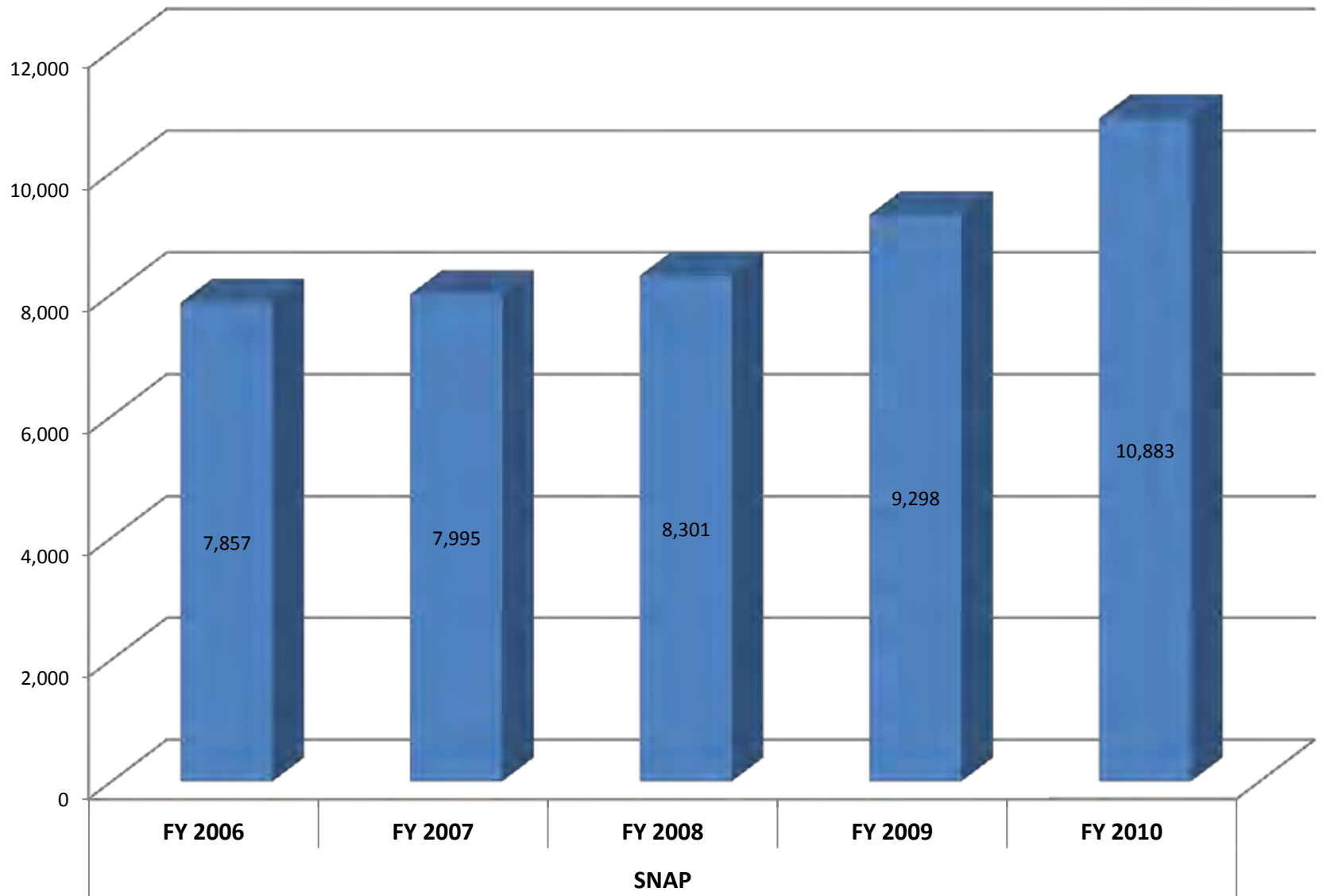
The poverty rate for children in Campbell County exceeds the state rate and is increasing at a higher rate.



# SNAP

*SNAP* stands for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, managed through the Department of Social Services. This program was previously known as the Food Stamps Program.

The next chart shows the number of individuals receiving SNAP. Note the increase in the past 3 years.

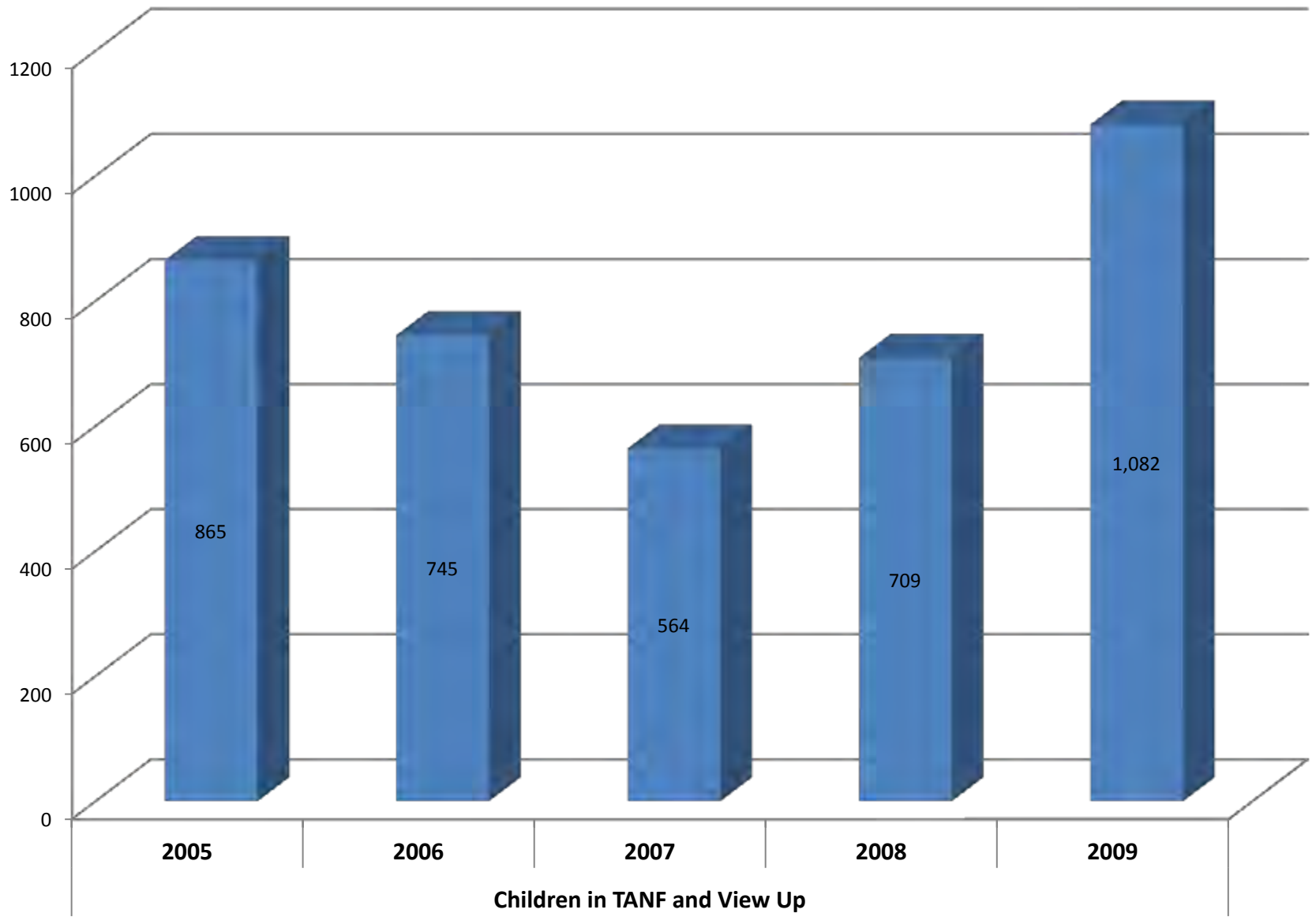


# TANF

*TANF* (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) provides financial assistance to indigent families.

This program was previously known as welfare.

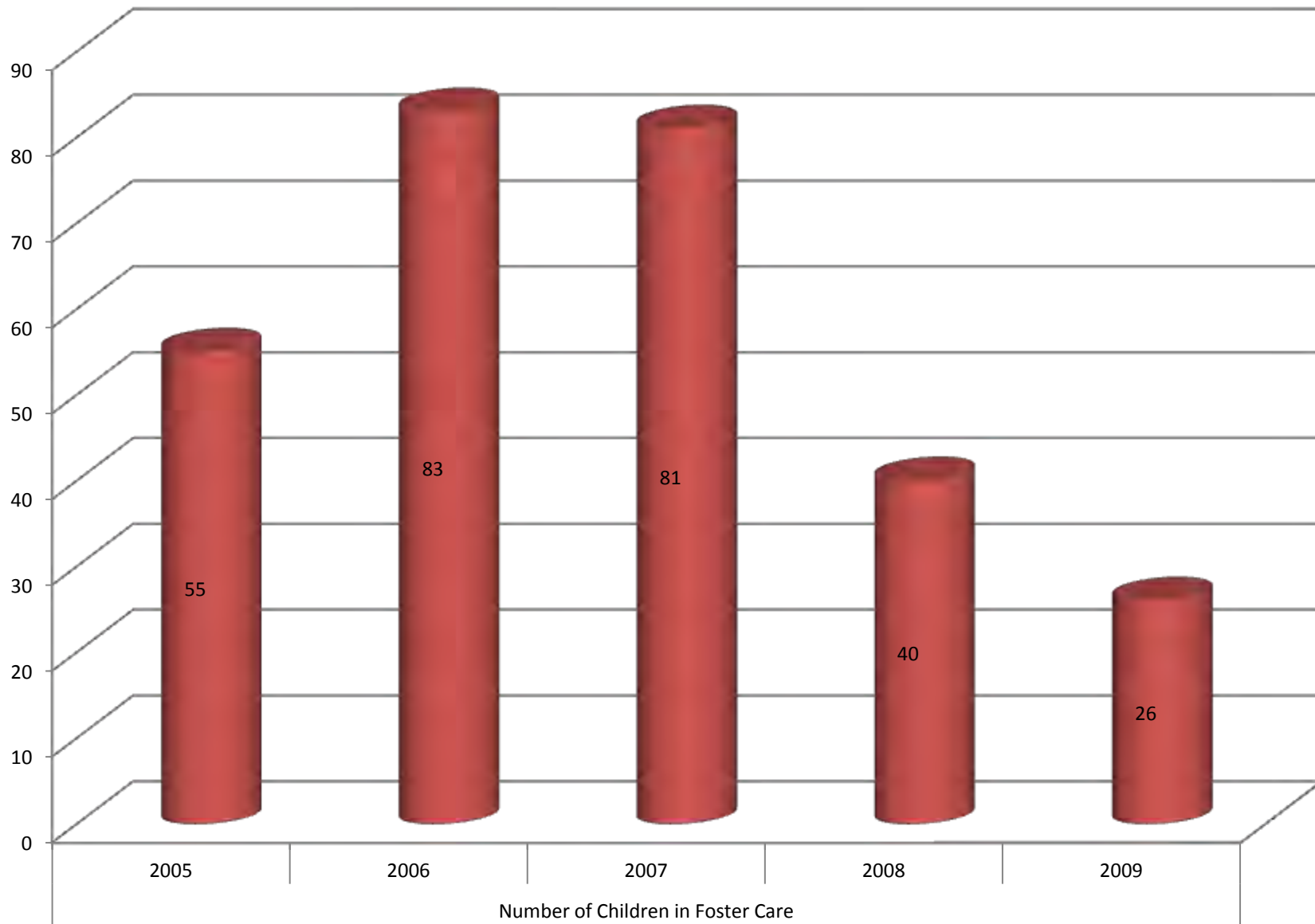
Following a decrease in 2007, the percentage has increased significantly.



Children in TANF and View Up

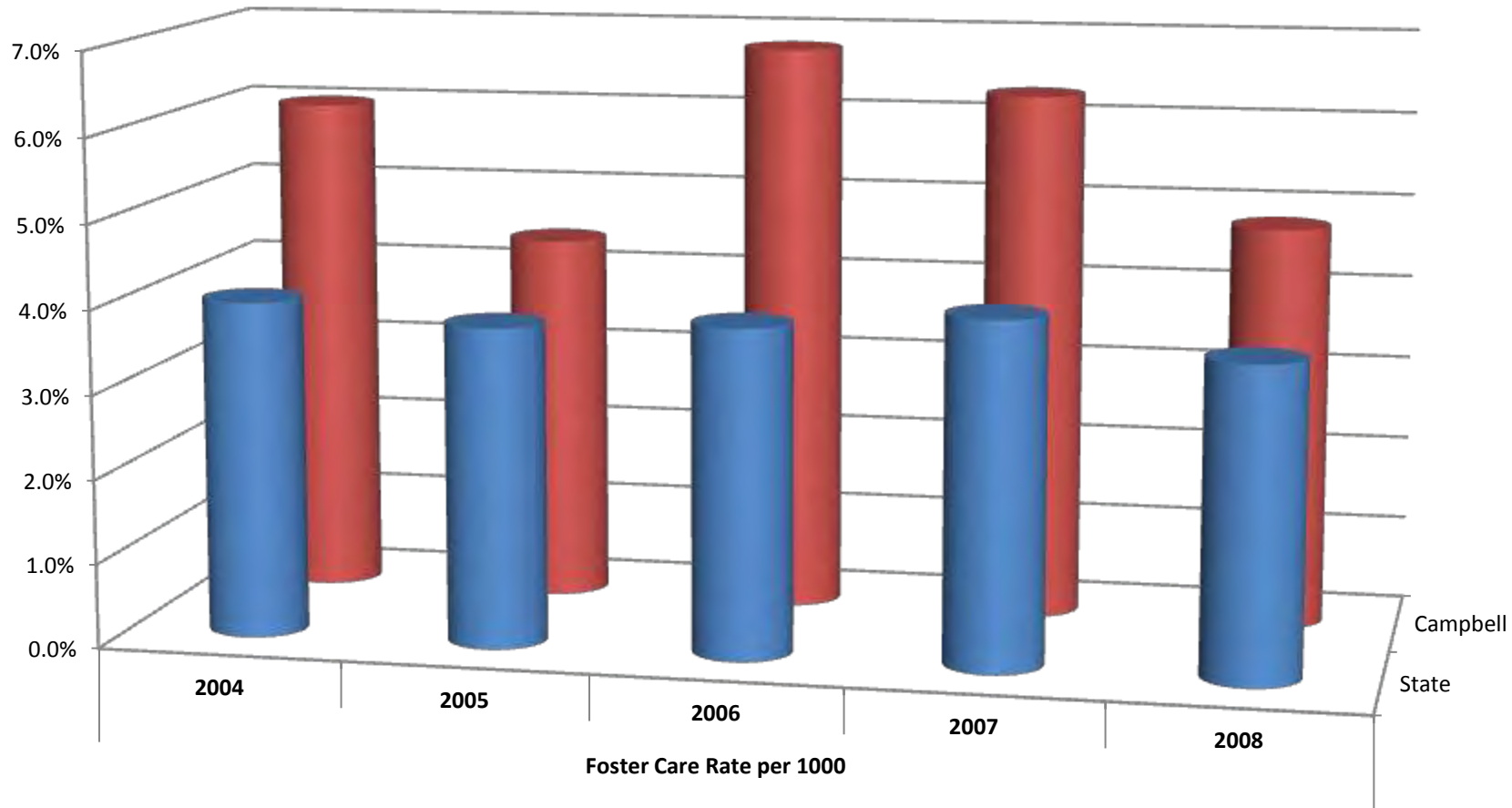
# Foster Care

The next chart shows the actual number of children in foster care in Campbell County during the given year. Note the significant decrease in numbers since 2007.



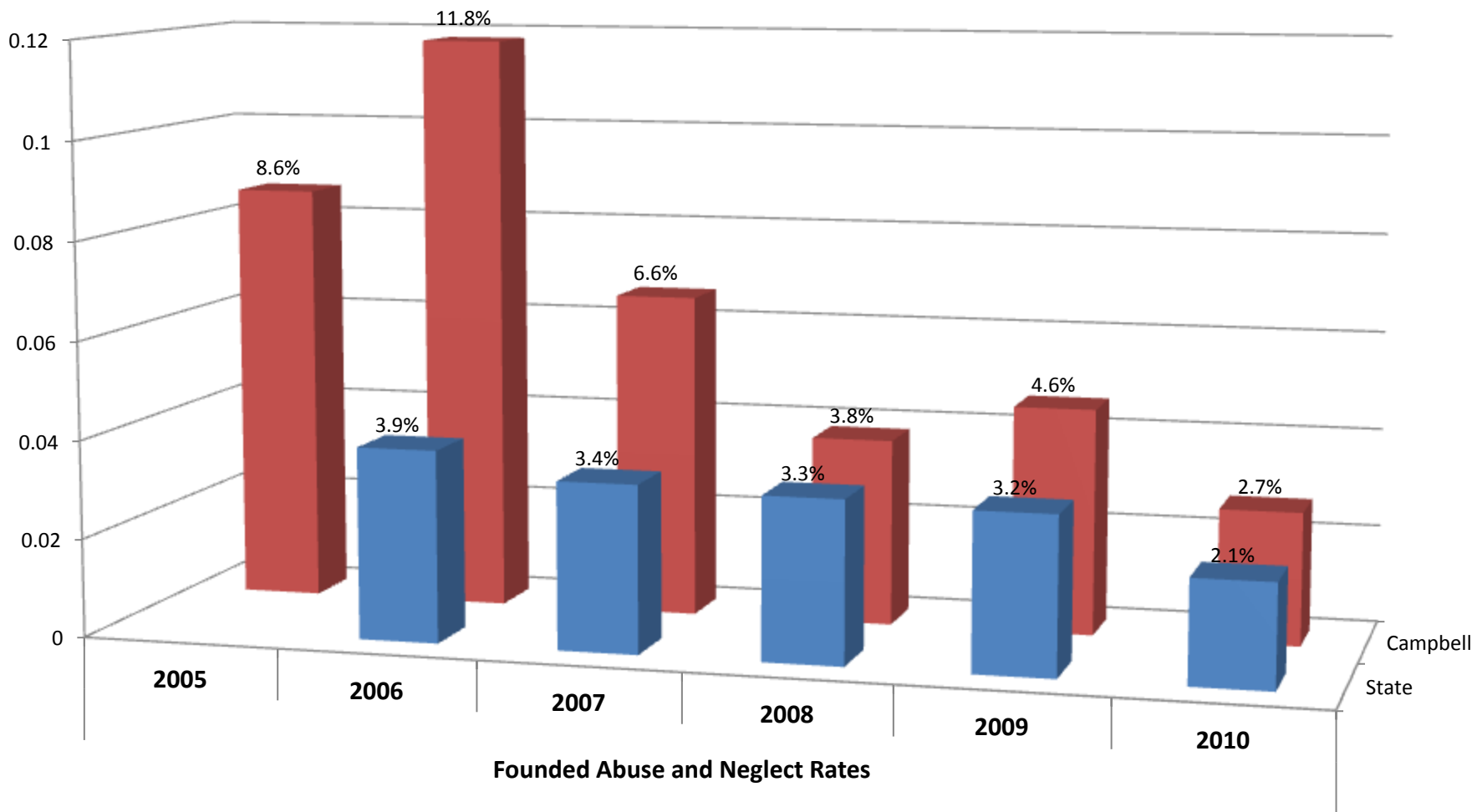
# Foster Care Rate

The next chart shows the per capita rate of children in foster care and provides a comparison to the state per capita rate. The per capita rate in Campbell County has traditionally been higher than the state rate.



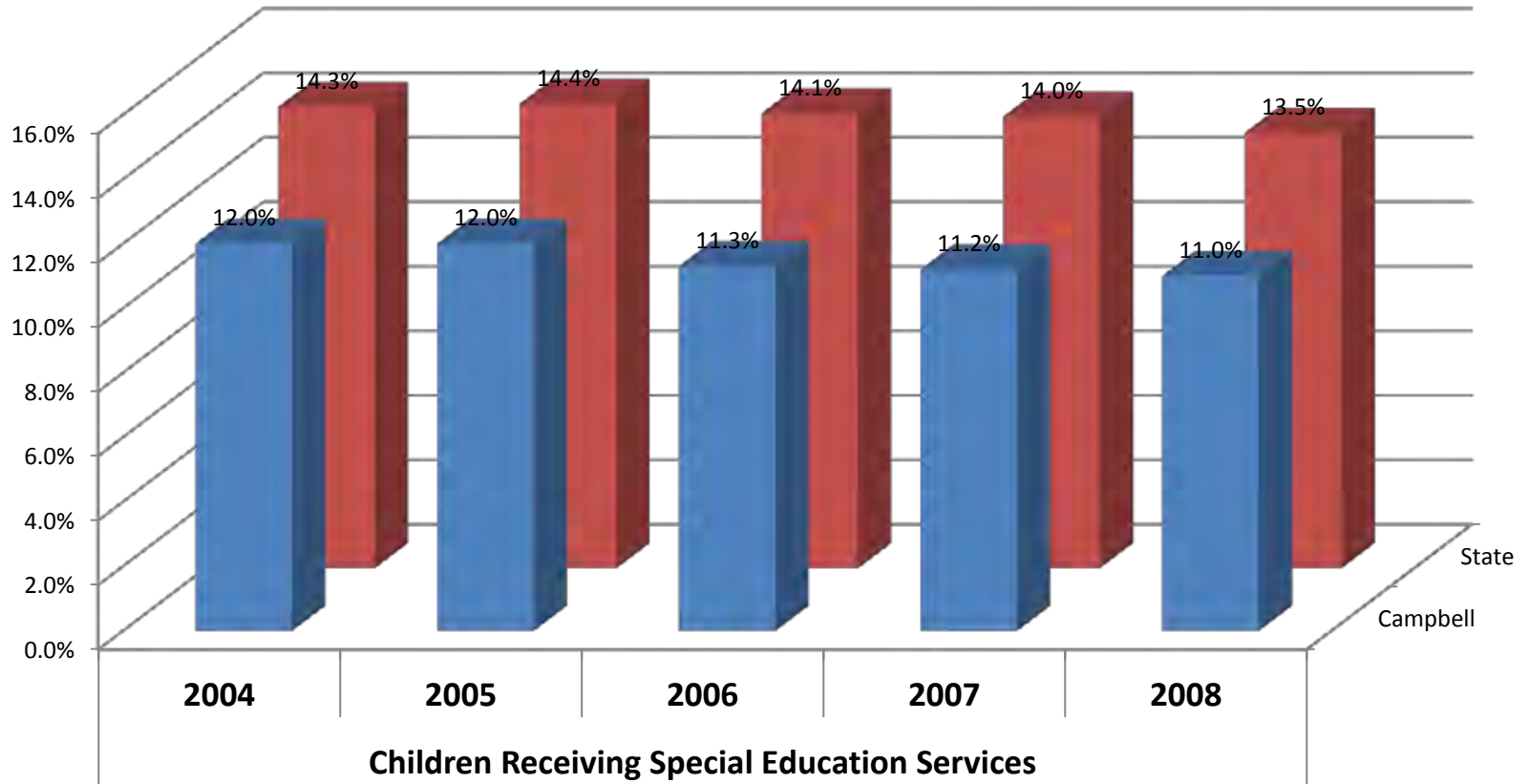
# Abuse and Neglect

# Special Education

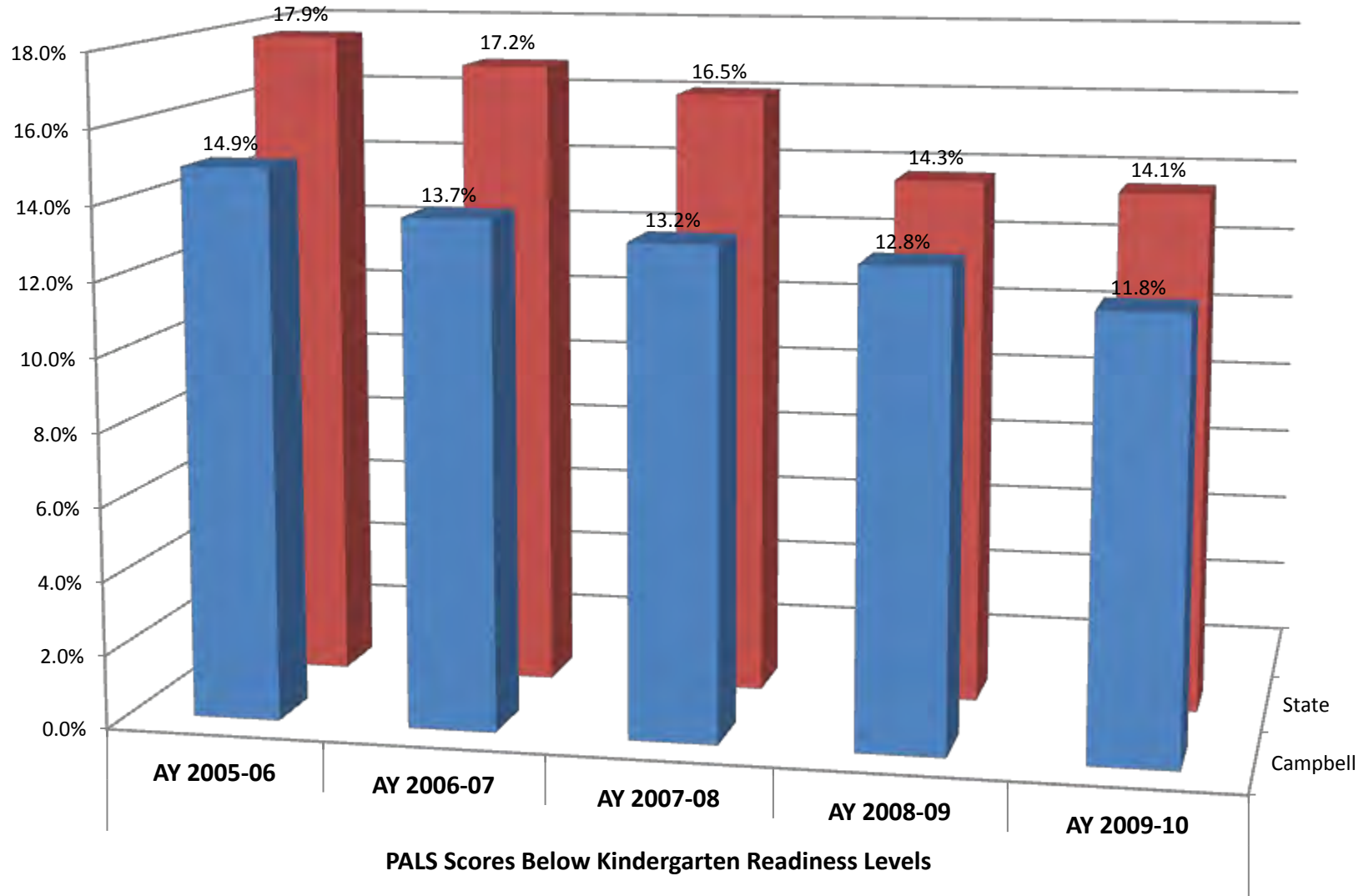
This chart shows the percentage of Campbell County students receiving special education services.



# PALS Scores

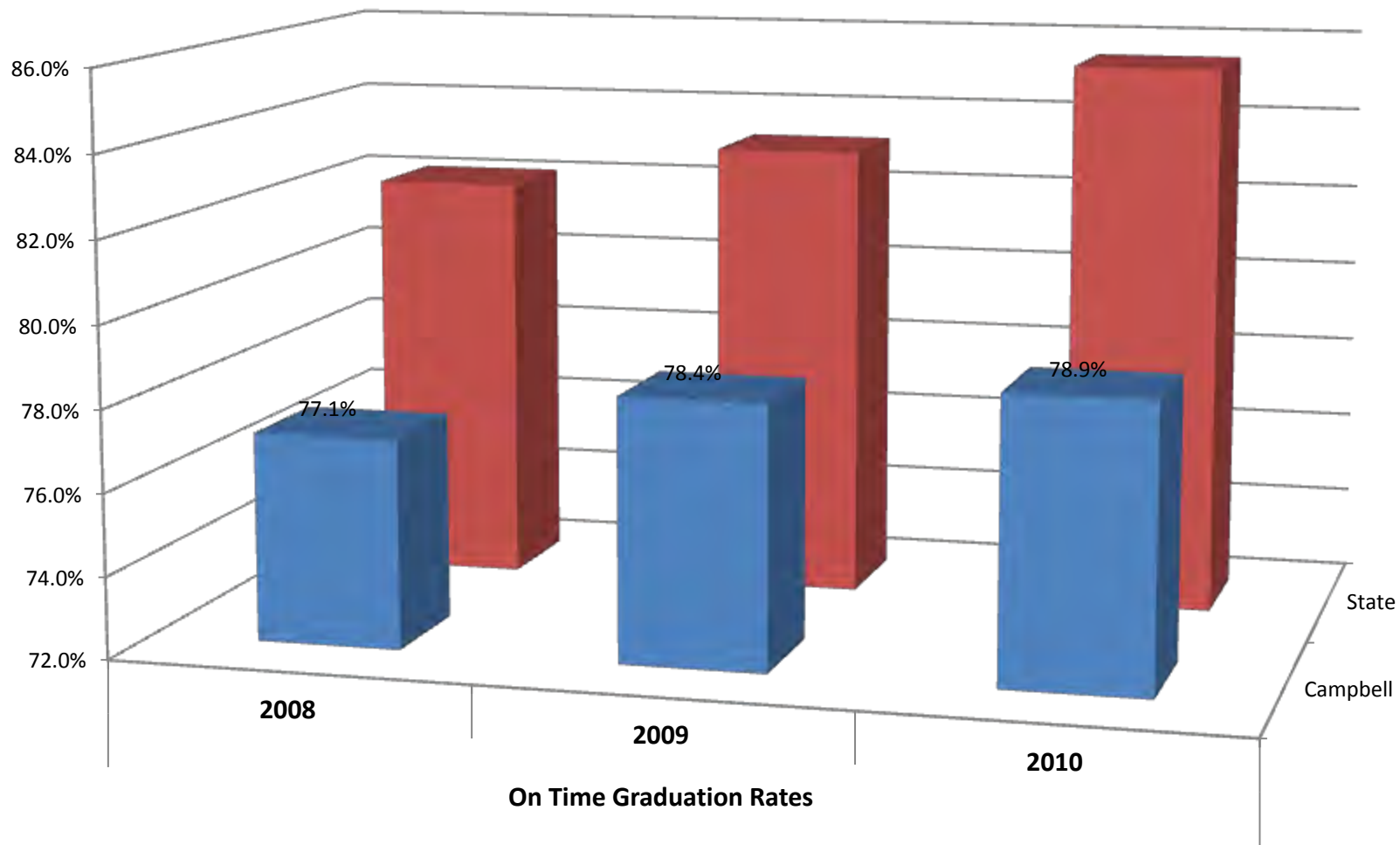
PALS (Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening) is a diagnostic assessment tool to measure fundamental literacy skills acquisition in children under 5.

Note that at both the local level and the state level there has been steady progress in decreasing the number of children who score below kindergarten readiness levels.



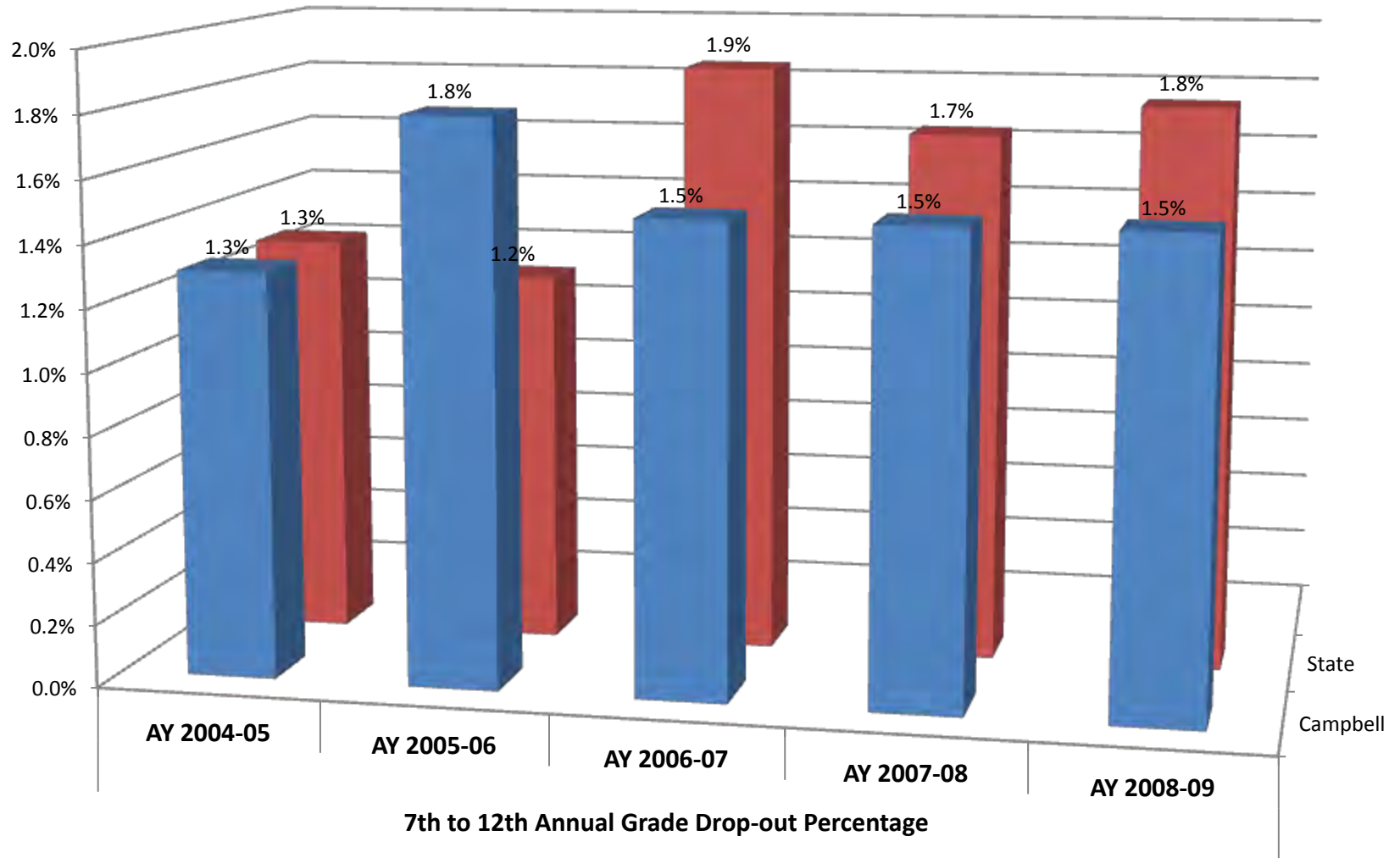
# On Time Graduation Rates

Beginning with the students who entered the ninth grade in 2004-05, Virginia began tracking individual students over the four years of a traditional high school career to determine the percentage who graduate on time. Previously, graduation rates have been calculated under several different methods. While Campbell County's on time graduation rate lags behind the state average, progress has been achieved in increasing the graduation rate.



# School Drop outs

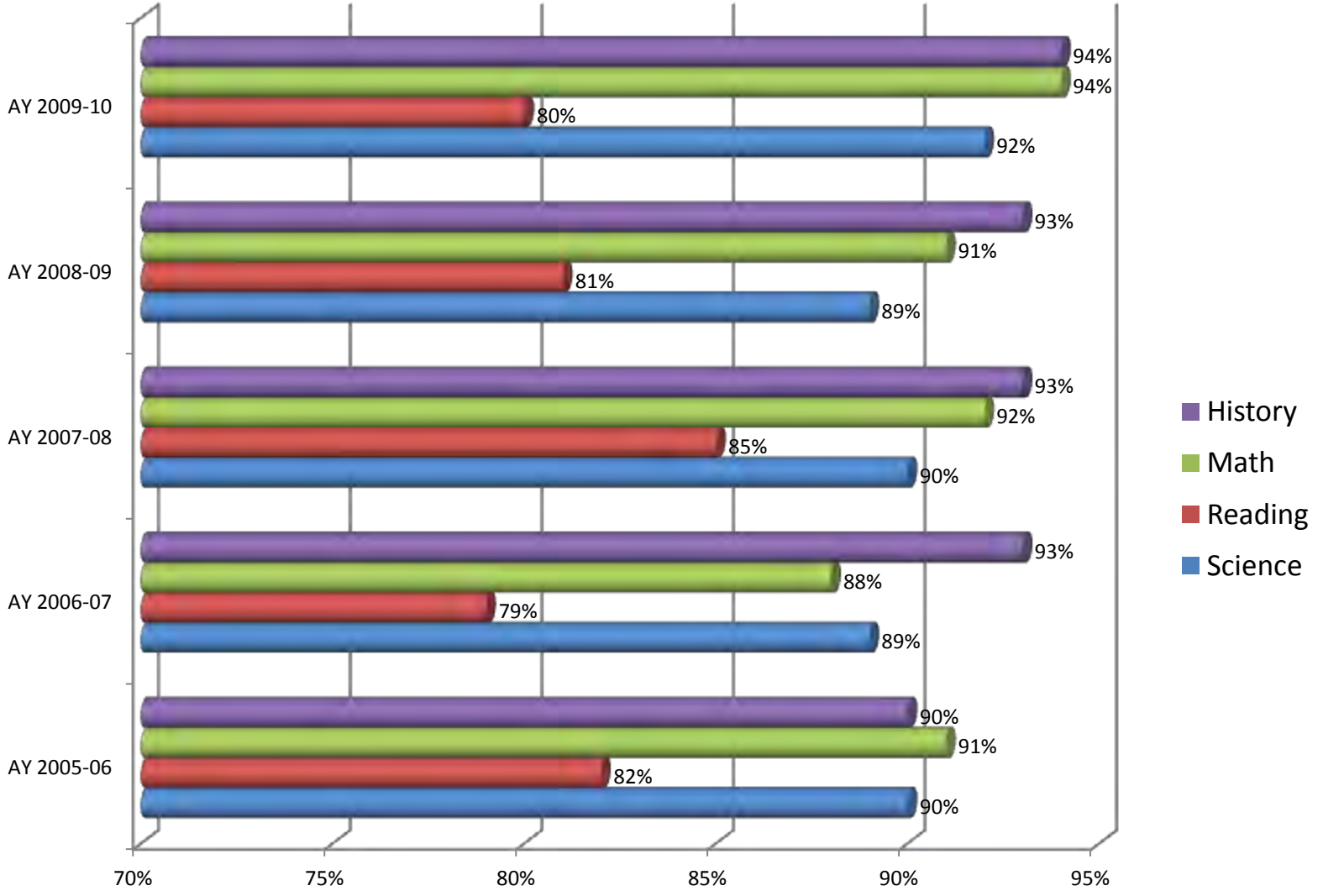
The next chart represents the percentage of youth dropping out of school in grades 7 through 12. Note that Campbell County drop out rate is now below the state average

- The next chart gives a five year history of SOL scores (Standards of Learning Scores) for 3<sup>rd</sup> graders in Campbell County. Scores in history, math and science have shown steady increases.

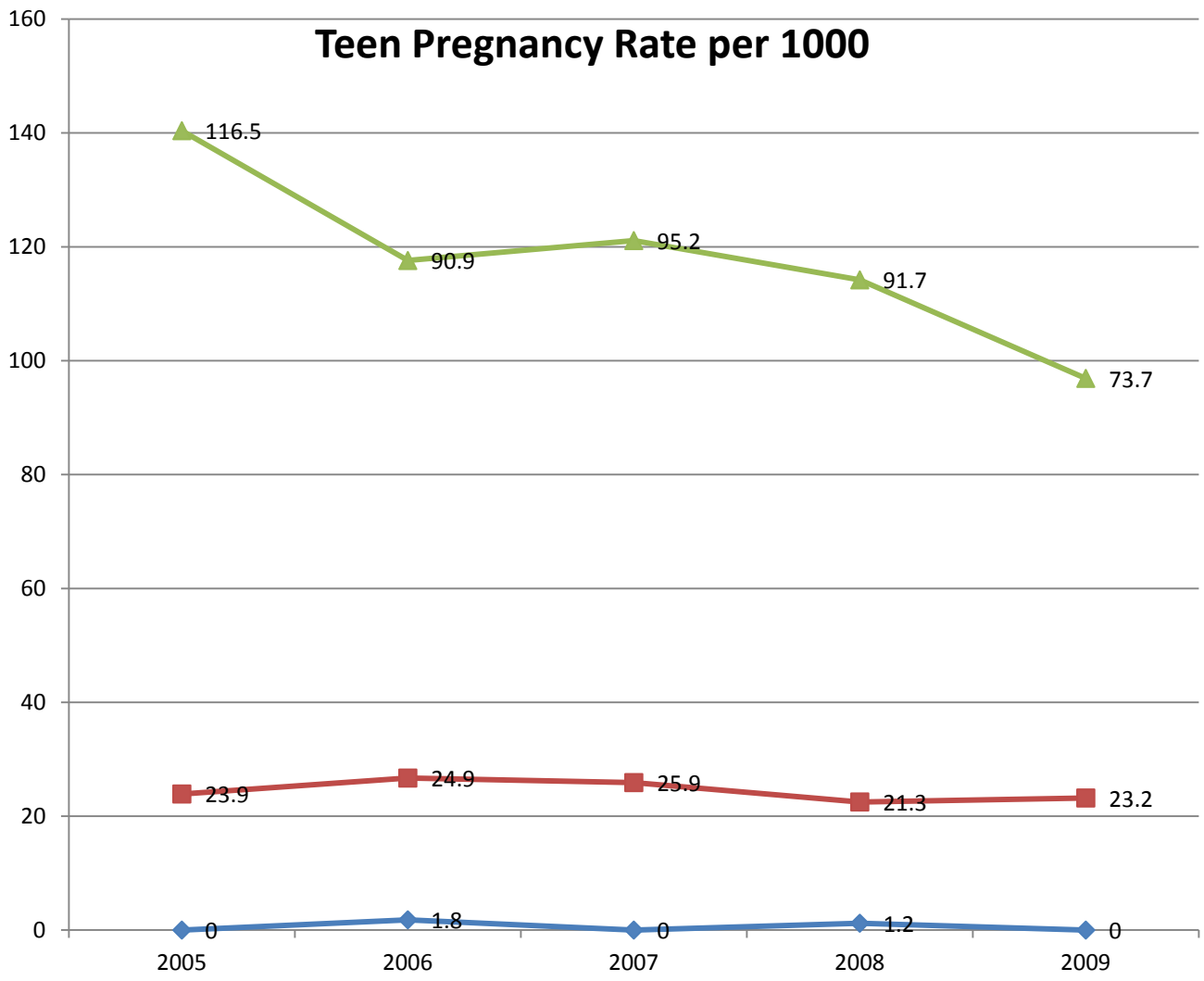
# 3rd Grade SOLs

Based on the following chart, note the reduction in the teen pregnancy rate for 18 and 19 year old females. The rates for girls 15 to 17 and under 15 remain stable.

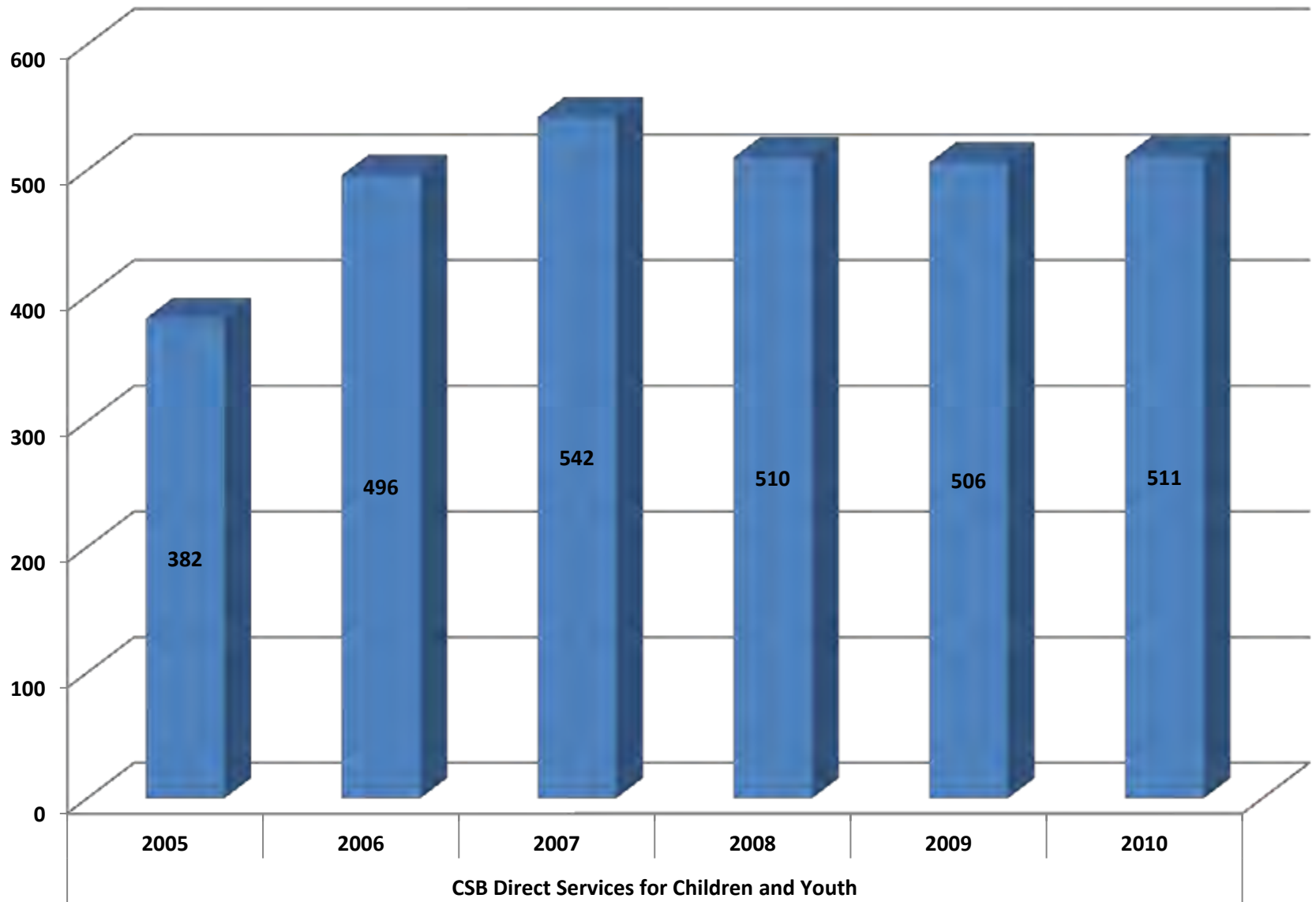
# Teen Pregnancy Rate per 1000

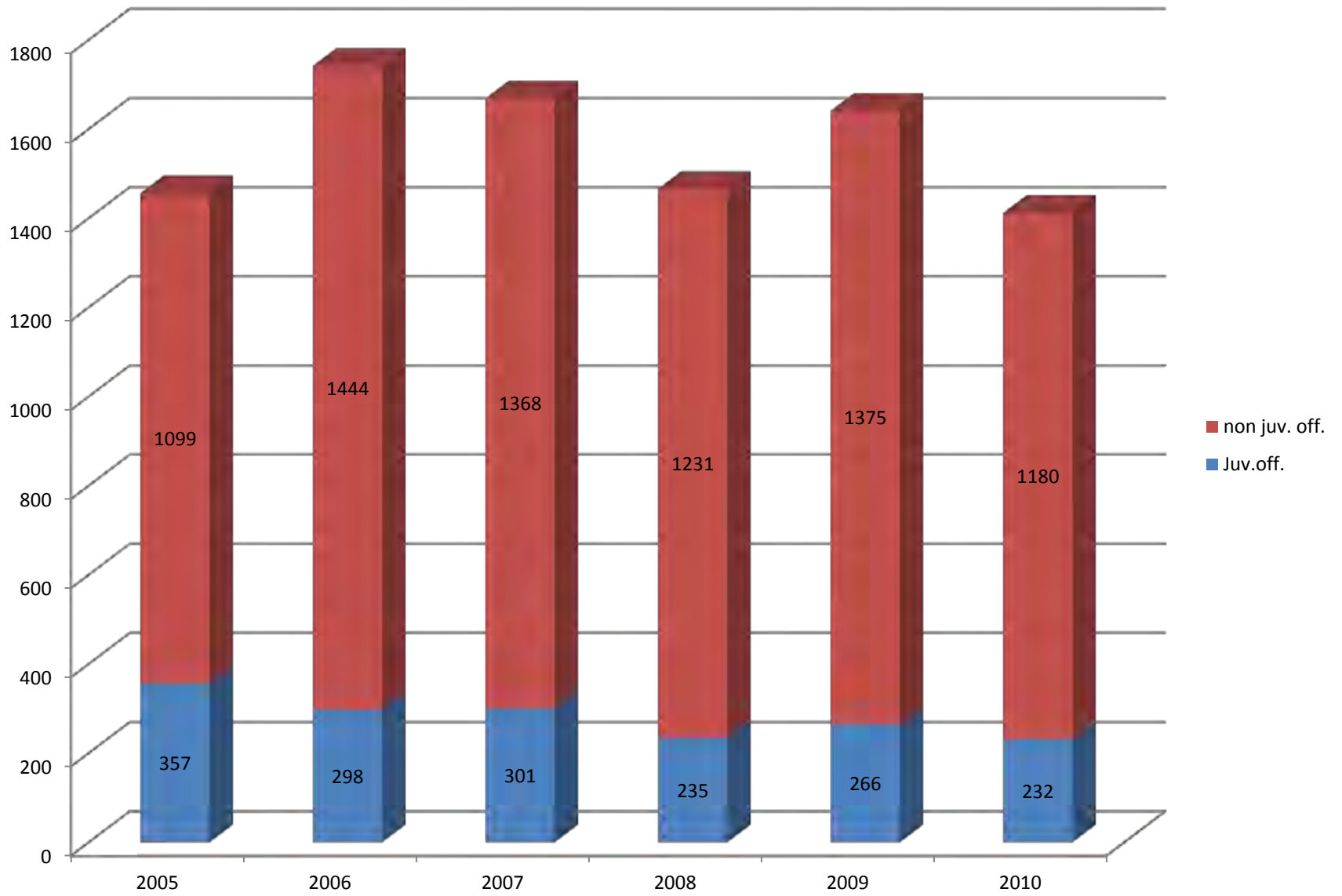
# Mental Health Services

# Juvenile Intakes

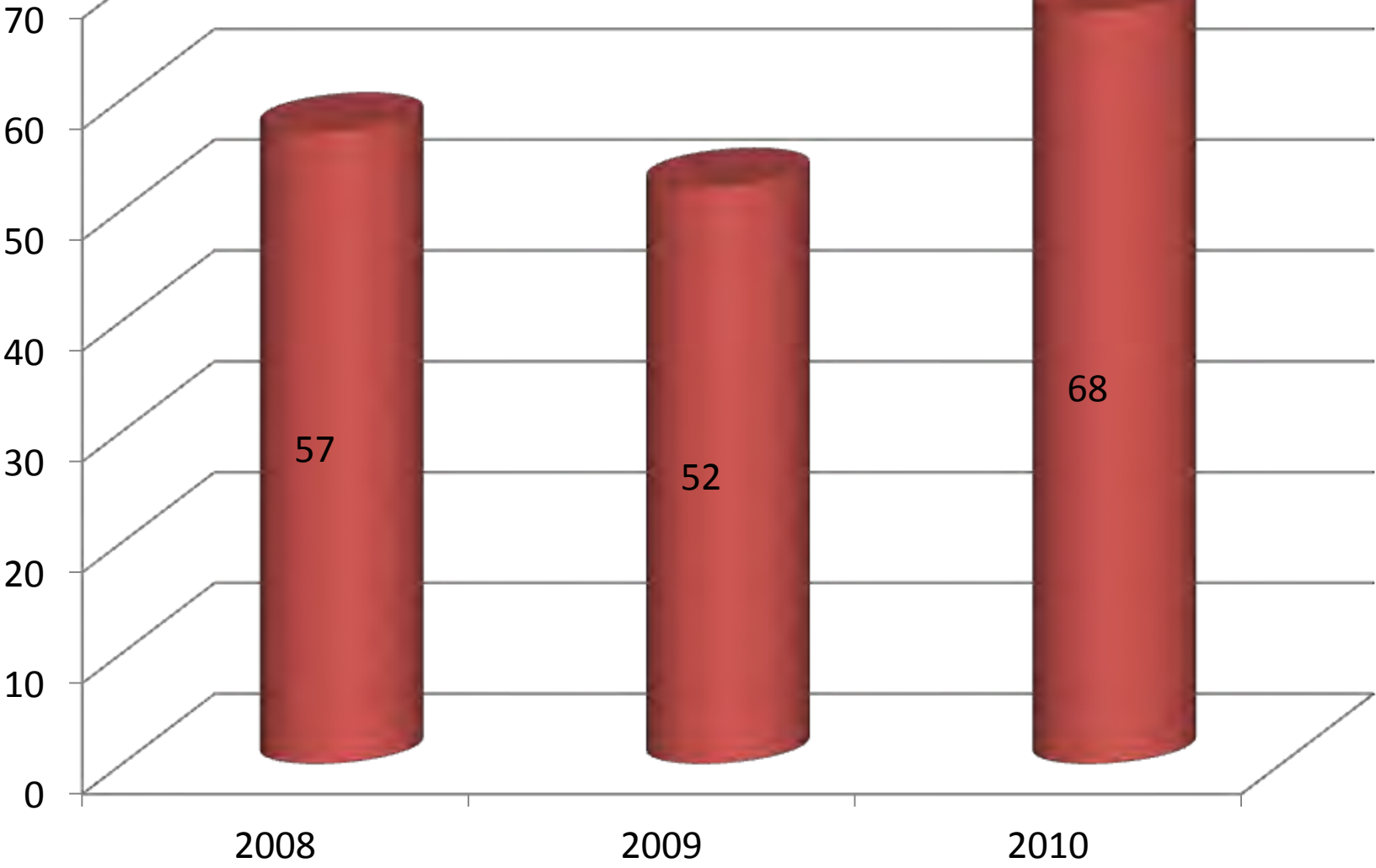

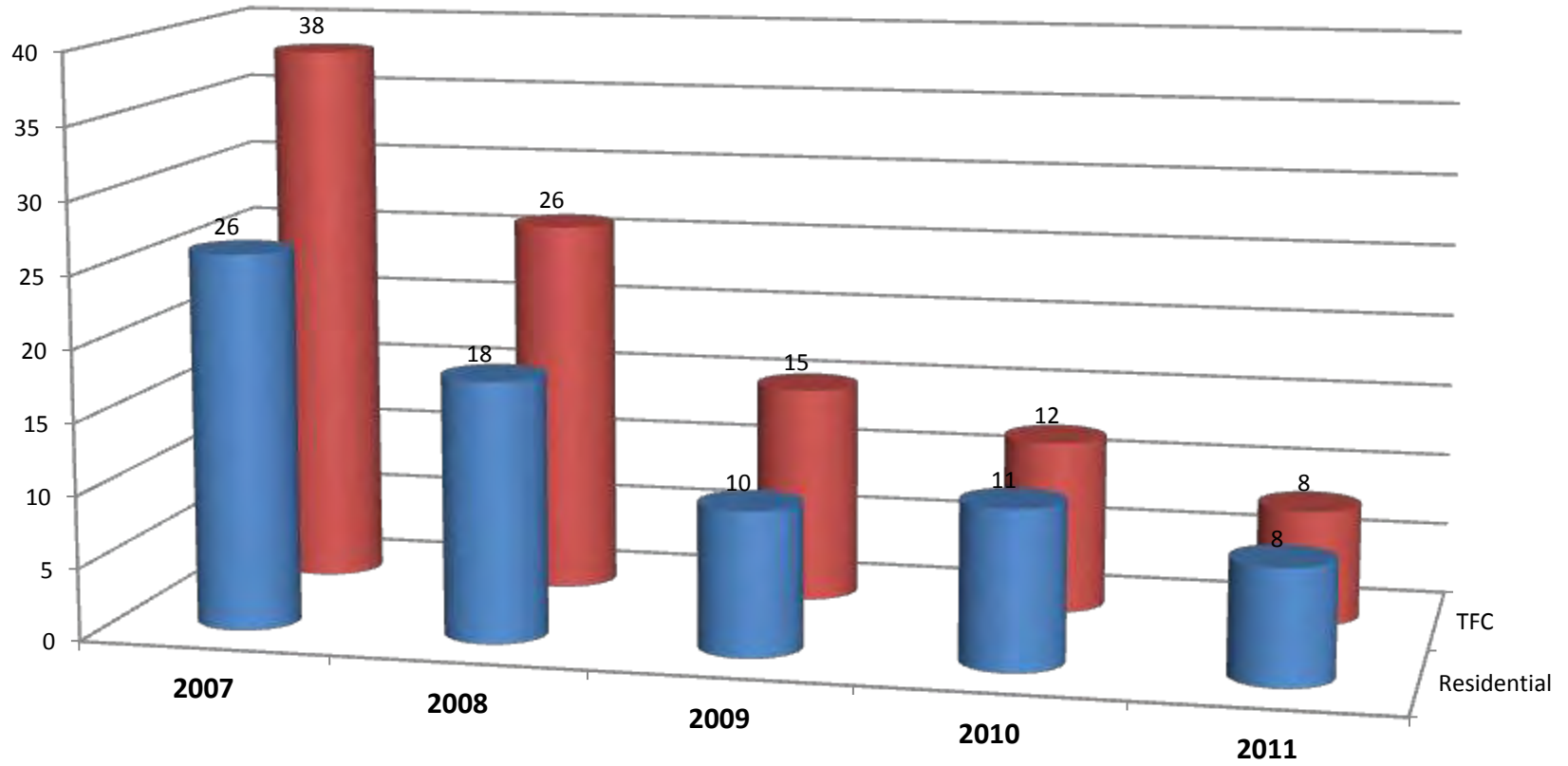


# Comprehensive Services Act Placements (CSA)

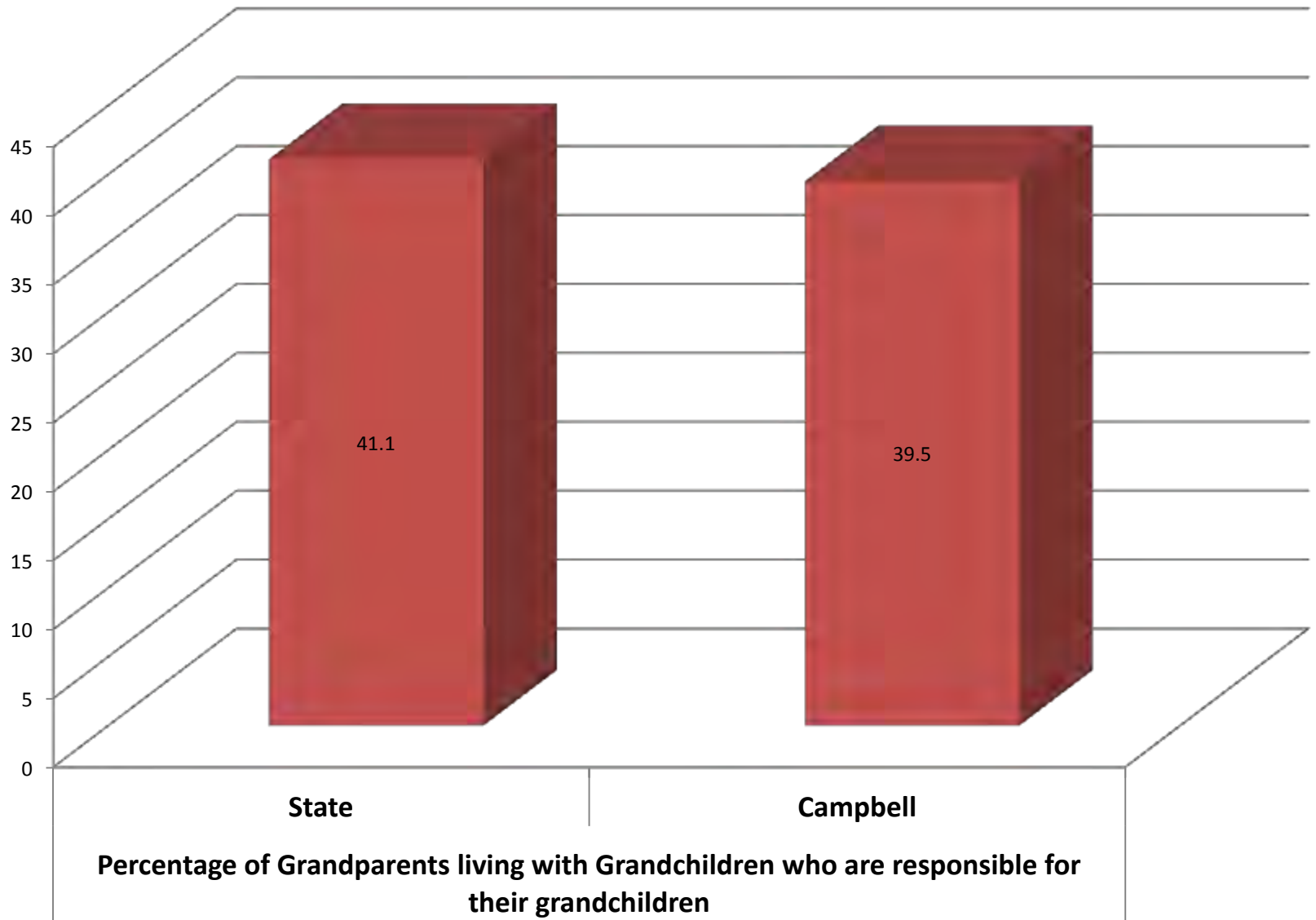
Residential placements include psychiatric hospitalizations, residential treatment facilities, group homes and wilderness programs.
