

FAQ's

1. What voting equipment does Campbell County use for the elections?
Campbell County uses Hart Intercivic Verity Voting System.
2. Are security measures in place with this voting system?
Yes, Data is stored in multiple locations, ensuring no loss of data and easy detection of any attempts to manipulate the data.
3. Are these systems connected to the Internet?
No Hart Voting System is ever connected to the Internet.
4. Do voting systems used in Virginia have to get their technology approved?
Yes, voting systems must pass rigorous, independent testing and receive certification on the state and federal levels which included security requirements.
5. Once my ballot has been place through the scanner can it be taken out and rescanned?
No, each ballot is numbered with a barcode. If it is sent through the scanner a second time it will be not be accepted.
6. If I request an absentee ballot by mail but then decide to vote at the polls on Election Day, will that be acceptable?
Yes, your name will be listed as an AB voter in the pollbooks. You must bring your absentee ballot with you and surrender it to the pollworker in order to vote. If you do not have your absentee ballot you will be allowed to vote a provisional ballot.
7. When I place my ballot in the scanner will it show me the votes that I cast to verify it was read correctly?
No, your vote is anonymous. It will show at the bottom of the screen on the counter that your vote was counted but it will not show you which candidate you voted for. Please make sure you review your ballot before placing it in the scanner.
